

Plant the Seed Today Incoming 3rd Graders

To best support student learning, and to ensure their brains stay sharp over the summer, students are being assigned summer reading. Your involvement as a parent is critical to the success of the Saint Hilary Summer Learning Program:

- Increased parent involvement leads to improved student achievement. (Fan & Chen, 2001 and jeynes, 2003)
- Parent involvement is the most consistent predictor of student success in school. (Bollen & Moles, 1994 and Warner, 1997)
- Children who perceive their parents as supporting academics in school perform better. (Epstein, 2001)

"... the amount and quality of student's access to materials is substantively related to the amount of reading they engage in, which in turn is the most important determinant of reading achievement." Studies show that students' who read more often, read better; they are also better writers, spell better, have larger vocabularies, and have better control of complex grammatical constructions (Krashen 2009)

- 2. Our Father
- 3. Hail Mary
- 4. Grace Before Meals
- 5. Grace After Meals
- 6. Act of Contrition/Sorrow
- 7. Angel of God
- 8. Mass Responses
