June 15, 2020 - COVID Task Force communication

Good day, All.

As our new Head of School, Jackie Gallo, said in her email this morning, the administration, COVID task force, and leadership team all are working hard to prepare for a new academic year. While we are still doing due diligence to keep our kids and staff safe during this global pandemic, the intention is to begin school together, at a distance, on our beautiful and spacious campus on August 19.

In the meantime we are pleased to report that, after reviewing current data and guidance from the state and county, the decision has been made to allow camps on campus this summer – providing they meet specific health and safety requirements. These requirements are based on state and county guidance and include limits to number of participants, use of outside or gym areas only, individual equipment per each child, temperature checks, and specific social distance, hygiene, and face covering protocols, and more. Camp directors are responsible for collaborating with the Head of School to adapt their unique programs and articulate these guidelines to participant families.

Please note that Presentation is not planning a camp program this summer but will gladly work with camp directors who are looking for a place to hold their programs and can meet the requirements.

Lastly, in the spirit of prudent caution, we point out this excerpt from the latest SoCo health ordinance:

"The evidence shows that a significant percentage of virus transmission is from people who are asymptomatic or have very mild symptoms. Health screenings may not detect these individuals. While a given activity may be allowed under this and the Governor's Orders, the Health Officer advises that community members conduct their own risk-based assessment of what activities are appropriate.

AN EXCEPTIONAL CHALLENGE

The global COVID-19 pandemic is affecting lives around the world unlike anything seen in the last hundred years. The impact on both public health and global economies is unprecedented. Repercussions on education systems and the resulting burden on children and societies everywhere are hard to calculate. In order to succeed, schools will need ingenuity, flexibility, resources, empowerment and a supportive community.

At the Presentation School, we are adapting to these challenging times in a way that is remarkably positive and generative. We are fueled by a growth mindset and grateful to our talented and dedicated community of teachers, staff, parents, students and trustees who have pulled together through these difficult times. We are well-equipped to navigate the challenges ahead as an even smarter, more adaptive, more determined and closer school.

OUR RESPONSE TO DATE

Extraordinary efforts by our faculty, coupled with earlier long-term planning decisions and technology investments, enabled us to launch a robust distance-learning program where every child was able to be online with his or her class on the first day of California's statewide shelter-in-place.

This program has allowed us to maintain our high academic standards, keep pace with our regular calendar (including the annual ERB exams) and continue our normal grading system. It has allowed students to matriculate to their next grade level, liturgies and beloved end of year celebrations to continue (in digital form) and 8th graders to graduate with a truly moving ceremony online. It has also given both students and their families a welcome sense of support and normalcy in an uncertain time.

Parent, student and teacher input has been essential to refining our distance-learning curriculum. Data gathered in our school-wide survey will be analyzed over the summer and used to create an even stronger educational program that will apply to every form that school might take in the next year.

LOOKING FORWARD

As we look to the future we recognize that disruptions are a fact of life, particularly in Sonoma where we have become used to mandated school closures for wildfire, smoke, rolling power outages and more. We humbly acknowledge that the path for maneuvering through the COVID-19 pandemic is unpredictable and often changing.

Presentation is fortunate to have a unique combination of assets that maximize our flexibility: the intentional small size of our student body; teachers who know all our kids individually; our beautiful 4.5 acre campus with generous outdoor areas; versatile room configurations which allows for alternative use of multiple spaces; and our status as an independent school which enables us to forge our own direction based on what we determine to be best for our school.

We will navigate the next academic year with "responsible flexibility" by anticipating and planning for a variety of responses to a range of unknowns. Health and safety is our number one priority as we envision returning to campus in the Fall. We recognize that younger learners in our lower school have unique learning needs which are best served by in-person interaction. While our intention is to have all students on campus (state and local guidance-allowing) we will build scenarios for both on- and off-campus situations, developing appropriate protocols for a healthy return as well as refined digital-learning blueprints should they be needed.

STRATEGIC GUIDANCE

Constructing a viable COVID-19 response plan requires both a strategic perspective and meticulous attention to detail. Our task force is actively engaged with national and local health and education resources, comparable best-in-class independent schools in the Bay Area, the California and National Associations of Independent Schools (CAIS and NAIS), SVUSD and local schools, and myriad specialist health, finance, risk management and other experts within our community in order to ensure we are steeped in the best available thinking.

- Promote personal connections and interactions that recognize the whole student.

- Recognize that our school campus is our most important physical asset and ensure that it continues to operate as efficiently and cost-efficiently as possible.
