Message From the Principal

Parents and families of St. Rose Catholic School students,

Thank you for all of your support and for helping to make such a smooth start to the beginning of the year. What a phenomenal start this has been to the school year! I have spent time in all of the classrooms and was able to witness firsthand the incredibly supportive and faith-based community that makes up St. Rose Catholic School. I always keep my office windows slightly cracked as it is so great to hear the sounds of laughter and joy coming in from the hallways and schoolyard. It has also been great to see how dedicated the faculty and staff are at St. Rose Catholic School. The rooms are looking great, the new teachers and teachers in new roles have transitioned smoothly, and everyone is excited for the upcoming weeks.

By now all families should have turned in their signed St. Rose Catholic School Family Handbook agreements and students should have brought in their emergency packets. The emergency

packets are kept out in a building on the schoolyard so that we may access them in case of fire, earthquake or another emergency/disaster. With the increase in school lockdowns, however, I feel that it would be prudent for the school to also keep bottled water, snacks, and a bucket in each classroom if the children need to remain in the classroom for an extended period. If there is anyone interested in donating a set (water and non-perishable snacks for 24 students and a bucket), I would very much appreciate it. I'm looking for eleven sets for all of the school rooms. These could be dropped off in the school office and would count for one service hour.

As many of you know, the Bishop of the Diocese of Monterey, Richard Garcia passed away on Wednesday, July 11 at the age of 71 from complications brought on by Alzheimers Disease with which he was diagnosed with in April. Standardized Testing: Our first of three standardized testing sessions will occur in September. These Star tests will run from September 17 – September 28. All testing is done electronically through the learning company, Renaissance, and will take place during classroom time. Please remember to have your children eat a healthy breakfast and bring a snack to school.

PK – 5 Back to School Night: PK - 5 Back to School Night will take place on Tuesday, September 5 from 6:00 – 7:00. This is a night for families to come and visit their children's' classrooms and find out information from their teachers. There will be two identical sessions which run from 6:00 – 6:25, and from 6:30 – 6:55 so that families with multiple children in these classes have an opportunity to visit more than one room.

6:00 – 6:25: Session 1

6:30 – 6:55: Session 2

Middle School Back to School Night: M.S. Back to School Night will take place on Tuesday, September 11 from 6:00 – 7:00. Families will sit in their children's' "homeroom" classroom (6th-grade room 7, 7th-grade room 6, and 8th-grade room 7) and find out information about their children's' subject teachers. Teachers will rotate between the classes in the order that students attend classes. Families will not need to rotate classrooms, except for elective period 8.

6:00 – 6:56: Periods 1 - 7 (8th-grade room 7, 7th-grade room 6, 6th-grade room 8)

6:57 – 7:04: Period 8 (Art-room 5, Spanish-room 8, Technology-room 6, Leadership-room 7)

Extended Care: I would like to welcome back Monica LePiane for her 6th year as Extended Care Director. Extended care will now be in the old fourth-grade portable directly next to the preschool playground. Extended care will run from 3:00 until 5:30 on full school days and from 12:15 to 5:30 on most minimum days (please check school calendar for availability). If you need to contact Ms. LePiane after 4:00, or if you have forgotten your key card and the office is closed, you may reach the extended care room at (805) 239-0304 ext. 121. As a reminder, there will be a \$20.00 fee charged if your child is

picked up after 5:30. I am working to add extended care on the first Friday minimum days in the near future. This is a work in progress, and I will keep you updated.

I have asked Ms. LePiane to make a "wish list" of items that she could use in extended care. If you are interested in donating to the program, some items that would be greatly appreciated include:

1. Sand toys: buckets, shovels, water cans
2. Playdough items: rollers, cookie cutters, etc
3. Interactive games for 4 or more children such as "Operation."
4. Quick drying clay
5. Pencils, markers, colored pencils, etc.

Responsible Citizens Who:

1. Are Good Examples: lead by example and take personal responsibility to become good role models for their community
2. Show Compassion: show compassion towards others, locally and globally, by sharing their talents and gifts
3. Make Peace: resolve conflicts peacefully and respectfully
4. Care for God's Creation: act as good stewards of God's creation
