According to Yolo County Health officials, "Schools can re-open to in person instruction on Tuesday, Oct 13, which is 14 days after our county was placed on the red tier on Sept 29 (count as day #1)." This opportunity is dependent on Yolo County staying in the red tier or better. For us, this means that 7th and 8th graders may join our TK-6th grade students on campus! It is recommended by the same health officials that we continue to follow all protocols that are in place with our waiver. We will continue to offer families a choice of in-person instruction or remote learning.

TK/K

We completed an art craft in which students created their own falling leaf wreath. In Social Studies, students learned about and discussed The Golden Rule

1st/2nd

In Social Studies, students identified American symbols and landmarks. First grade is writing their Spelling words 3x each every night for homework and second graders are writing their Spelling words 5x each. 3rd/4th

5th/6th

Students began learning about how spore baring, coniferous and flowering plants reproduce. In 6th grade math, students are finding solutions to equations and in 5th grade they are computing the difference (subtracting) of decimals involving tenths and hundredths.

7th/8th

Students began using Decision Point as part of their preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation. Atoms, elements and molecules have been the focus in science. Eighth grade history has brought the Salem Witch Trials to life as they watched and discussed the movie. Pre-algebra students were determining the unit rates with ratios of fractions.

Holy Rosary Parish Celebrates 150 Years of Service in Woodland

A few Catholic services occurred in Yolo County as early as 1821, but it was in Oct. 1870, that Holy Rosary Parish dedicated its first church as Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. In 1874, construction of a new church building at the corner of Main and Walnut Streets was begun, and that church was dedicated on June 1, 1913 and was used until 1949. The current church building at 301 Walnut St. was dedicated on Oct. 2, 1949.

Holy Rosary Parish opened its first Catholic School in 1886 with a staff of nine Holy Cross Sisters. The school became known for its academic excellence, initially for girls and later for boys as well. The Holy Cross Sisters served until 1977. In 1980, the Sisters of the Religious of the Blessed Virgin Mary began their service at Holy Rosary Catholic School until 1986.

God willing, in May of 2021, Holy Rosary Parish will have a festive celebration in honor of our 150 years of service!
