Activities in the TK/K Classroom

Students were so excited to be back! They were learning about directional words such as left, right, in front and behind, As well as the importance of knowing their personal information such as their address and phone number. Students saw the Google map image of the school and they thought it was so neat to see the school on Google maps! In math, kindergarten students are working on the concept of



subtraction. For example, this week we took a dive into telling stories about separating, stories about take away and students were able to create their own subtraction problems. TK students worked on patterns and coloring by number.

Students enjoyed reviewing sight words outside on Friday. They also learned about the Epiphany and created their own crowns in honor of the Three Kings.



Students Absences and Returning to School
