2021-2022 Registration

Registration for existing and new families is open. Please login to your SchoolSpeak account and select the [Registration 2021-2022](#) link in the left menu to start the process. All families need to update their profile in SchoolSpeak which is our student information system. Starting at that page, families will also need to update FACTS accounts. FACTS is our tuition management system. **All families will be required to be on FACTS this year, no exceptions!**

Registration fees for TK-2 grades are \$550 and grades 3-8 are \$600. The traditional tech fee has been combined with registration to reflect this one amount. A \$50 discount will be applied if registration is paid by April 12, 2021.

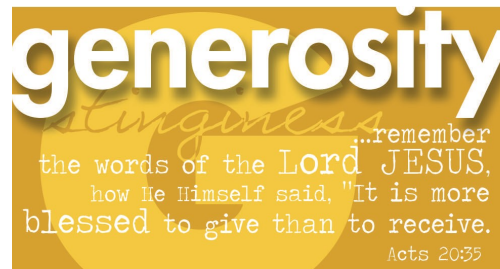
Classroom Activities

TK/K—Congratulations to Annabelle, Robert, Jackson, Saeed, and Sota on receiving 100% on Topic 12 Math Test! This week in religion, students learned about the story of David and King Saul. Students learned the importance that a heart for God prepares us to be used by God. On Wednesday afternoon, as a whole class we did Stations of the Cross and students did very well. In Math, we have been learning about sorting shapes and objects by their attributes. In ELA and Social Studies, we talked about the seasons and different weather. Students were able to hear and see the rain and thunder during our lesson about weather. It was great! Students have been reviewing their sight words by creating sentences with only sight words and drawing a picture.

1/2—Due to inclement weather, students participated in Stations of the Cross inside the classroom this past week. They took turns reading each station and did an awesome job. Our Spelling Bees for the week were Zelda Ezrre, Breelyn Farrell, Isabella Marsh, Brayden Ramos, Isaac Reyes, Katherine Ruiz, Ajay Takhar and Kacey Kip for earning 90% and above on their Spelling Test. Also, congratulations to Valentina Barrera, Harper Cruz, Bobby Johnson, Gissel Marzal, Annabelle Meraz, Viviana Moreno, Hayley Phelps, Elizabeth Rios, and Luna Tamayo for earning 90% or above on their Vocabulary Chart Test. If your child is a second grader he/she has the Act of Contrition prayer in their Religion folder inside their homework binder. Please practice with your child every night so that they are prepared for their First Reconciliation with Fr. Jonathon or Fr. Ed. We have been practicing every day in class and they are doing great.

3/4—As we continue our Lenten journey in this 3rd week of Lent, we prepared for confessions by reviewing the Act of Contrition, the steps involved in a confession, and practicing reverence and grace. Math 3 and 4 continue their work in fractions by locating fractions on number lines, creating equivalent fractions, and comparing fractions. Students are well aware at this point how important it is to have a

strong math fact fluency base in multiplication and division. We wrapped up our chapter in Social Studies on governments. Students learned each level of government beginning with local, community, state, and national, and their inner workings. We look forward to jumping back into Science next week where we will begin to study the survival of living things. Lenten Rice Bowls

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) is the official relief and development agency of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Students Absences and Returning to School

When students are not going to be attending school on any day, please contact the office at 530.662.3494 by 8:30 am. **When students return to school, they must have a note with the reason for absence and it needs to be signed by parents/guardians– or a health care provider if appropriate.** Copies of negative COVID test results (printed versions of screen captures are acceptable) or doctor diagnosis of alternative explanations are also needed. **We must be informed of all students who are exposed to COVID 19 positive persons (including family members), those who have been quarantined by health care officials, or have tested positive to COVID 19.**
