Academic

Letters:

- i says "i" as in inchworm
- u says "u" as in umbrella

Writing:

This week our students are learning to write their names correctly (begin with a capital letter, and the rest of the letters are lowercase). They are also writing the letter i.

Math:

- number concepts 1-3

Students are learning:


- to sit quietly, "criss-cross applesauce"

Academic

We are off to a great start in our new school year! Our preschoolers are already learning so much. This week, our focus is shapes and colors, as well as learning school routines and making new friends.

This year your child will be learning many things about God's world, and he/she will be developing language skills with the help of many animal friends. Coloring, painting, and gluing will help develop manual skills. Stories, poetry, and music will aid the development of comprehension, language and thinking skills.
