The A-G funds will be used to increase the number of California high school pupils who graduate with A-G eligibility. Additional support staff will use the A-G CIG funds are targeted to serve students in grades nine through twelve who are in these specific categories. Funds shall be used for activities that directly support pupil access and successful completion of the A-G course requirements including creating more A-g Courses and providing supports for success in A-G courses..

All students will have access to the A-G courses.

Courses were offered during inter-sessions and summer school and each student met with an advisor to revise or form a high school graduation plan.

We will expand and continue to Develop a comprehensive advising plans and other student supports, such as tutoring and course-taking and college counseling services. We will also subsidize student test fees, including AP test fees, for low-income students, foster youth, and English learners. We will continue support concurrent enrollment with Community Colleges and a dual enrollment course will launch in Fall of 2022 for 9th grade students with Fresno City College. We will be expanding this type of program to other counties in the future.
