New Business

Reclassification- What does it mean to reclassify, Student passed the ELPAC exam that requires students to read, write, speak and listen proficiently in English using academic and informal vocabulary. Student is meeting academic standards in the coursework. Student is meeting expectations on other academic assessments. The teacher recommends the student for reclassification. The parent agrees that the student is ready to be reclassified. The student is now proficient in English and no longer requires the support of the English Development Program! It is a symbol of hard work, perseverance, and dedication!

2022/2023 Dashboard- 60.6% of English learners made progress which is an increase of 12% from last year.

On the ELA test English Learners were 13.8 points below the standard which is an increase of 23.4 points from last year. In Math English Learners were 40 points below the standards which is an increase of 31.3 points.

ELPAC Resources were shared to help students prepare for the ELPAC testing coming in February including: ELPAC Writing Videos ELPAC Practice Test and Scoring Guide (3-5) - ELPAC Practice Scoring Guide (6-8), ELPAC Task Types- What different skills are needed on the test. Designated Supports for testing were shared including translation and text to speech. In-person testing option will be available on March 26 and 28. In person test preparation sessions were shared.

Adventures in Math and Writing information was shared- enrichment support to help reinforce and practice concepts and vocabulary
