This week, we are highlighting children who are showing great improvement in self-control—using calm bodies, gentle hands, and thoughtful words. We're excited to celebrate their positive choices!



Jaxon has shown wonderful growth in self-control when feeling frustrated. He is becoming more confident using his words to let classmates and teachers know what is bothering him. Jaxon has also been working hard to pause his body and stay calm, even when he's been pushed or bumped during play.



Max has shown great improvement in self-control when he feels himself becoming very excited. He has developed the habit of stepping away to practice his 5-finger breathing until he's calm and ready to play safely. Max also demonstrates wonderful self-control when leading the line during pick-up, patiently waiting and staying focused to model positive hallway behavior for his classmates.

November is here, and it's a wonderful reminder of all the things we are thankful for! This month, our Little Saints joyfully welcomed two new friends, Nico and Isabel, into our classroom community. As familiar friendships continue to grow and new ones begin to bloom, we've been focusing on strengthening our communication, problem-solving, and emotional regulation skills.

Recently, we've been practicing helpful phrases that support positive interactions during play. Expressions like "Can I play with you?" or "I would like to play alone" empower children to clearly share their needs. We've also been learning that it's okay when a friend wants to play independently. With gentle guidance and redirection, the children are becoming confident using timers to take turns, finding new play areas,

Using Expo markers, the children are gaining confidence tracing and writing, while our chalkboard has become a favorite spot for finger-tracing chalky letters.
