Dear St. Vincent de Paul Community,

The recent rain has refreshed our spirits, cleansed our air and nurtured our plants. Let us continue to pray for rain to replenish our water supply. Let us pray that we be refreshed by the many blessings that we experience here at St. Vincent de Paul.

It is thrilling to note the large number of families who expressed interest in St. Vincent de Paul School as evidenced by the kindergarten applications. Our K, 1, 2 instructors screened potential students and visits to the preschools of the applicants provided additional information about each child. Yesterday letters were mailed to all applicant families. We accepted a full class of kindergarten Vikings and have a sizable waiting list if openings occur. We are particularly grateful to Marie Ferdon who coordinated admissions and Susan Sherman who played an enormous role in the process.

Imagine spending a week surrounded by 215 acres of redwood forests, meadows, creeks and a beautiful lake. That's exactly what our sixth grade class is experiencing this week. Deepening their connection with the environment and valuing each other form the essence of the Caritas Outdoor Education Program. The benefits of this program are numerous as the sixth grade class will gladly tell you when they arrive home tomorrow afternoon. Thank you to Ms. McCabe-Isom who so graciously accompanied the twenty-six students.

This week a special guest speaker introduced fifth grade students to the wonders of the *Balclutha*, a three-masted, steel-hulled, square-rigged ship built in 1886 to carry a variety of cargo all over the world. As you may know, the *Balclutha* is berthed at the San Francisco Maritime National Historic Park. In early March, fifth graders will spend the night on the *Balclutha* assuming the roles of typical 19th century sailors. It is no wonder that in preparation they needed to gather their mates, form small crews, learn to tie knots and even sing a shanty tune or two.

Fathers and Daughters, mark your calendar for the social event of the year. Saturday night, February 22nd is the traditional Father-Daughter Dinner and Dance in the style of the roaring 20s. All of you flappers grab your dapper dads and prepare for a spectacular evening.

Each year the Archdiocesan Office of Child and Youth Protection mandates that every school in the diocese provide a safe environment student education program. In the next weeks, "A Personal Safety Curriculum: Talking About Touching" will be taught at every grade level. This curriculum is developmentally and age appropriate, covering a variety of topics. The K, 1, 2 and 3 curriculum will be taught by the classroom teachers. Fourth through eighth grades complete an online curriculum.

On Monday we met with Officer O'Rourke, our school liaison officer from Northern Station. At this meeting he informed us that the individual arrested last Wednesday has a prior record in another state and violated his parole by being present on campus. In spite of the recent incidents it is the officer's assessment that St. Vincent de Paul School provides a safe environment. He reminded us to keep all exterior doors closed and continue to be vigilant to strangers. Officer O'Rourke assured us that the police are always available to us and will be conducting additional patrols around the school. You may have seen a patrol car circling campus at drop off. We have investigated gate options and are finding that more complex than initially thought, but continue to search for the best ways to create a closed and safe campus.

We are grateful to all of you who have worked with us during this time. We sincerely appreciate your ongoing support.



A Personal Safety Curriculum

Talking About Touching

Kindergarten -3rd grade

In the coming weeks the SVDP teaching staff will be implementing **A Personal safety Curriculum:** *Talking About Touching* mandated by the San Francisco Archdiocese. The curriculum emphasizes the importance of following safety rules, what to do when they are lost, what to do if someone wants them to go somewhere, and touching safety. We encourage you to review and reinforce these lessons in your home:

- The Always Ask First Rule: Always ask your parents or the person in change first if someone wants you to go somewhere or someone wants to give you something.
- The Safety Rules: (1) Say words that mean "No"; (2) Get away (run and use your voice); and (3) Tell a grown-up.
- The Touching Rule: A bigger person should not touch your private body parts except to keep you clean and healthy (safety and health reasons only).
- In addition, we will be talking about **Car safety** (always wear seatbelt and sit in booster seat until big enough), **Bike safety** (always wear a helmet), **Gun safety** (never play with guns), **Fire safety** (never play with matches or fire), **Phone safety** (never give out personal information), **Walking safety** (look in every direction before crossing a street).

Kid Safety

Help Kids Stay Safe 4th through 8th grades

Students in grades 4-8 will take Kid Safety, an engaging and entertaining online course.

Kid safety alerts kids to different kinds of harm: adults harming kids (child abuse); kid on kid harm (bullying); and self-harm (peer pressure and harmful choices).

4th grade: Safety Smarts for Kids 5th grade: Block the Bully 6th grade: Be Safe, Stay Safe 7th grade: Bullying, Not Cool 8th grade: Digital Citizenship

More information will be shared with you through your classroom teachers when they begin implementation.

- Officers may not hold office more than two (2) consecutive one-year terms.

Treasurer:

- Responsible for making deposits
- Processing expense reports
- Reconciling bank statements
- Creating financial reports

- Budget analysis and forecasting.

Secretary:
