Dear Queen of All Saints' Community,

Today was an exciting learning day for the students as we introduced special Faith Family curriculum focused on a safety theme of the month. This month's focus was on building community and relationships. While in their Faith Family groups, students rotated through four stations including Art, PE, Spanish, and Safety Class to complete various activities and projects. Their "Fill Your Bucket" Art posters, and their kindness brain-storming posters will be placed around the school to remind students to treat each other and themselves with kindness. While the students rotated through four stations, the classroom teachers were working on gathering and analyzing data from current STAR assessments. Data will be used to differentiate classroom instruction based on student needs, create student and classroom curricular goals, and inform our academic programs and curricular decisions. Faith Family Safety Day will take place monthly on our 1/2 day Wednesday. Check the school Dojo stories for pictures! Keep posted to the Scoop to learn about next month's safety focus.

You will experience station rotations at **this evening's Back to School Night**. We are excited to bring this classroom management and curricular strategy to our parent/guardian community. Your patience and flexibility will be required to ensure smooth rotations through our four short blocks of informational stations: Grade-Level Appropriate Social Emotional Learning with Mr. Rhyan Ramirez; WCEA/WASC Accreditation with Mrs. Prince; PACE and School Board events and information with Mrs. Heidi Flores and Mrs. Erleen Richards; and teacher meet and greet with Enrichment Teachers. We will begin **promptly at 6:00 p.m.** to insure enough time for the stations and classroom visits. We are looking forward to seeing you tonight. Please remember to wear the color-coded name tag that the oldest student in each family brought home this afternoon.

*Reminder: Due to limited space, Back to School Night is for adults only. Any students on campus (including the school yard) will be escorted to Extended Care, and regular hourly fees will apply. Extended Care will open at 5:45 for those needing services.*

We have had a question about our handbook's Fast Food policy. To clarify, food ordered from a national chain restaurant and delivered to the students to eat at lunchtime is considered fast food. Uber-type deliver lunches are also considered fast food. Fast food lunches are often a distraction to the students who have a home-packed lunch. Therefore, as has been the policy for the last ten years, students who have a restaurant lunch delivered to school are asked to eat in the school office. All students play outside during their 15-minute playtime. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

**Registration Cost is \$190.00 and Uniform is \$65.00 (you keep the uniform and reuse next season). Players need to bring:**

1. Cash or check made payable to Queen of All Saints CYO for \$255.00 – if they have the uniform that they purchased from the year before then just a check for \$190.00 is needed. You are able to make a payment using a credit card, Visa or Mastercard. There will be a \$2.00 fee per transaction.
2. Copy of Birth Certificate (Not needed for QAS students or returning players)
3. Proof of residency (not needed for QAS students) – PG&E, phone or cable bill.
