The Easter Season is almost here. Easter goes on for fifty days and is the second longest season in the Church's liturgical year. It culminates with Pentecost where scripture tells us that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles (Acts 2:1-31). As we enter the Easter Season, I invite you to discuss, as families, what this Season is about and how we can continue to observe far beyond the Easter Sunday that the world observes. Our students are very knowledgeable. At a recent assembly, I asked them to tell me about the end of Lent and what was to come.

So many of them knew about Palm Sunday which begins Holy Week which leads to the Triduum which ends with Easter. This Easter, when you attend Mass as a family, take notice of all the changes in the liturgies - Father Mark's or Father Brian's white or gold vestments, the singing of the Alleluia before the gospel once again and the Sprinkling Rite which reminds us of our baptismal vows. Overall, our liturgical prayers are more celebratory during Easter because this is the most important time for us as Catholics. It is a celebration of Jesus' victory over sin and death and a reminder of our salvation!
