Dances

St. Patrick-St. Vincent Catholic High School sponsors closed dances, limiting attendance to students of the school who are admitted by SPSV student ID card, and guests who have completed guest bid forms. Each student is allowed one guest. **Public displays of affection, including suggestive dancing, are not tolerated.**

All students must show student ID cards in order to be admitted. No ticket sales at the door.

Guest bid forms are available two weeks prior to a scheduled dance from the student activities director. Completed guest bid forms are due to the student activities director. All guest bids must be approved by an SPSV administrator. Our administration reserve the right to reject bids, or rescind bids, for any reason.

Every student who invites a guest is responsible for informing guests about the dance dress code and related regulations. The dress code will be published prior to each dance and posted via email and advisory.

Each guest must have completed a guest bid form, have purchased a guest pass, and be escorted into the dance by the SPSV student.

No drinking, smoking or vaping or drugs are allowed at school dances. Anyone identified as under the influence of alcohol or drugs will be refused admittance and parents will be contacted. If SPSV administration, faculty, or staff identify a student as under the influence of alcohol or drugs after the dance has started, SPSV will contact the student's parents and ask them to take their child home.

All students are subject to Breathalyzer testing, as well as a search by SPSV's contracted safety dog and handler.

Failure to adhere to school policy related to dances can lead to significant disciplinary measures.
