Dear Parents of Incoming Sixth, Seventh and Eighth Graders,

Welcome to Middle School! Next year you will have a homeroom teacher as well as a different teacher for language arts, math, history, religion, science and several specialty classes.

To prepare yourself for the upcoming school year, over the summer you need to do something academic once a day. Here are some suggestions:

Math: 6th, 7th & 8th graders: KNOW your math facts (addition, subtraction, multiplication & division) Review the rules for fractions, decimals, positive and negative numbers.

Required Summer IXL Math: Your child needs to complete the IXL math lessons outlined on the following page. They will use their same username and password from this school year. New students will receive their login information via email.

Language Arts: 6th Grade: Students are required to read the assigned book listed below for the incoming grade. Students need to create a notebook that contains the following: (1) One-page chapter summary for each chapter of the book; (2) The chapter summary needs to include the characters, main events, and conflicts and written in complete sentences. Bullet points are not acceptable. The notebook will be used as a study tool for the test that will be given within the first week of school on the summer reading. The notebook will be collected and graded. The notebook and the novel test will be the first grade in the gradebook for the 2020-21 school year. There is also IXL for Language Arts. Current students use their login and new students will receive their login information via email.

Language Arts: 7th and 8th Grade: Students are required to read the assigned book listed below for the incoming grade. Upon finishing the book, students will: (1) Write a minimum two-page summary of the book. The summary must include the characters (protagonists, antagonists), main events, and conflicts. The paper is to be written in complete sentences with the utilization of complex writing skills and proper paragraphing. Bullet points will not be accepted. (2) You will write an additional minimum one-page opinion on the assigned book and its relevance to today's society, as the assigned book includes topics pertinent to the world today. This writing, as well as a test given the first week of school will be your first grades in the grade book.

Required Summer Reading:

6th grade: *Danny the Champion of the World*, Ronald Dahl

7th grade: *Stargirl*, Jerry Spinelli

8th grade: *The Boy in the Striped Pajamas*, John Boyne

Required IXL Language Arts: Your child needs to complete the IXL language arts lessons outlined on the following page. They will use their same username and password from this school year. New students will receive their login information via email.

History: 6th, 7th & 8th graders: Watch two history shows and write a one-page summary on each show. You can find a historical related show on the History Channel, National Geographic, and other networks. This will be turned in at the beginning of the school year and be the first grade in the gradebook for the 2020-2021 year.

Don't forget to order school supplies from *1st Day School Supplies* (link on school's website) by June 15th. They will be delivered directly to the classroom with your child's name.
