Selection Process

The GTUSD Board of Trustees has retained the El Dorado County Office of Education to recruit qualified candidates. EDCOE will screen applications and recommend candidates to the Board for interviews and further consideration. Any contact with the Board members prior to interviews, in an attempt to influence the selection process, will be considered a breach of professional ethics. Board members reserve the right to visit the district and community of a candidate prior to a final decision. The Superintendent/Principal will be expected to begin on or about January 4, 2021.

Salary and Contract

Salary is negotiable. The salary will be competitive and comparable based on districts of similar size and scope. A multiyear contract is preferred.

The District

In the town of Placerville, GTUSD is home to one elementary and one middle school which serve more than 660 students and is a district that focuses on great care and personal relationships with its families and staff. The district is committed to working with families to ensure that student needs are met. Along with excellent academic programs, the district is dedicated to providing robust enrichment programs such as band, performing arts and Odyssey of the Mind.

GTUSD is nestled in the Sierra Nevada foothills of El Dorado County near the American River and the historic site of where gold was discovered in 1848.
