

INSTRUCTION

AR 6130 Family Life Education

Family Life education programs operated by the County Office of Education shall satisfy all of the following criteria:

(a) Criteria:

1. Instruction and materials shall be age appropriate.
2. All factual information presented shall be medically accurate and objective.
3. Instruction shall be made available on an equal basis to a pupil who is an English learner, consistent with the existing curriculum and alternative options for an English learner pupil as otherwise provided in this code.
4. Instruction and materials shall be appropriate for use with pupils of all races, genders, sexual orientations, ethnic and cultural backgrounds, and pupils with disabilities.
5. Instruction and materials shall be accessible to pupils with disabilities, including, but not limited to, the provision of a modified curriculum, materials and instruction in alternative formats, and auxiliary aids.
6. Instruction and materials shall encourage a pupil to communicate with his or her parents or guardians about human sexuality.
7. Instruction and materials shall teach respect for marriage and committed relationships.
8. Commencing in grade 7, instruction and materials shall teach that abstinence from sexual intercourse is the only certain way to prevent unintended pregnancy, teach that abstinence from sexual activity is the only certain way to prevent sexually transmitted diseases, and provide information about the value of abstinence while also providing medically accurate information on other methods of preventing pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases.
9. Commencing in grade 7, instruction and materials shall provide information about sexually transmitted diseases. This instruction shall include how sexually transmitted diseases are and are not transmitted, the effectiveness and safety of all federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved methods of reducing the risk of

contracting sexually transmitted diseases, and information on local resources for testing and medical care for sexually transmitted diseases.

10. Commencing in grade 7, instruction and materials shall provide information about the effectiveness and safety of all FDA-approved contraceptive methods in preventing pregnancy, including, but not limited to, emergency contraception.

11. Commencing in grade 7, instruction and materials shall provide pupils with skills for making and implementing responsible decisions about sexuality.

12. Commencing in grade 7, instruction and materials shall provide pupils with information on the law on surrendering physical custody of a minor child 72 hours old or younger, pursuant to Section 1255.7 of the Health and Safety Code and Section 271.5 of the Penal Code.

- (b) Instruction and materials shall not teach or promote religious doctrine.
- (c) Instruction and materials shall not reflect or promote bias against any person on the basis of any legally impermissible categorization, including sex, ethnicity, race, national origin, religion, color, disability.

All pupils in grades 7 to 12, inclusive, shall receive HIV/AIDS prevention education from instructors trained in the appropriate courses. Each pupil shall receive this instruction at least once in junior high or middle school and at least once in high school.

HIV/AIDS prevention education, whether taught by school district personnel or outside consultants, shall satisfy all of the criteria set forth in paragraphs (1) to (6), in paragraph (a) and (b) and (c) above and shall accurately reflect the latest information and recommendations from the United States Surgeon General, the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and the National Academy of Sciences, and shall include the following:

- (1) Information on the nature of HIV/AIDS and its effects on the human body.
- (2) Information on the manner in which HIV is and is not transmitted, including information on activities that present the highest risk of HIV infection.
- (3) Discussion of methods to reduce the risk of HIV infection. This instruction shall emphasize that sexual abstinence, monogamy, the avoidance of multiple sexual partners, and abstinence from intravenous drug use are the most effective means for HIV/AIDS prevention, but shall also include statistics based upon the latest medical information citing the success and failure rates of condoms and other contraceptives in preventing sexually transmitted HIV infection, as well as information on

other methods that may reduce the risk of HIV transmission from intravenous drug use.

- (4) Discussion of the public health issues associated with HIV/AIDS.
- (5) Information on local resources for HIV testing and medical care.
- (6) Development of refusal skills to assist pupils in overcoming peer pressure and using effective decision-making skills to avoid high-risk activities.
- (7) Discussion about societal views on HIV/AIDS, including stereotypes and myths regarding persons with HIV/AIDS. This instruction shall emphasize compassion for persons living with HIV/AIDS.

It is the intent of the County Office to encourage pupils to communicate with their parents or guardians about human sexuality and HIV/AIDS and to respect the rights of parents or guardians to supervise their children's education on these subjects. The County Office intends to create a streamlined process to make it easier for parents and guardians to review materials and evaluation tools related to comprehensive sexual health education and HIV/AIDS prevention education, and, if they wish, to excuse their children from participation in all or part of that instruction or evaluation. The County Office recognizes that while parents and guardians overwhelmingly support medically accurate, comprehensive sex education, parents and guardians have the ultimate responsibility for imparting values regarding human sexuality to their children.

A parent or guardian of a pupil has the right to excuse their child from all or part of comprehensive sexual health education, HIV/AIDS prevention education, and assessments related to that education.

If any instruction in comprehensive sexual health education and HIV/AIDS prevention will be taught by outside consultants, or if that instruction is to be given in any assembly by guest speakers, the parent or guardian of a pupil shall be notified about that instruction, no fewer than 14 days in advance of the instruction.
