Student Endangerment

The administrator in charge of Charter Community School programs or his/her designee may exclude any student if the administrator determines that an emergency situation exists. "Emergency Situation" means a situation where it has been determined that the continued presence of the child would constitute a clear and present danger to the life, safety or health of the student, other students or El Dorado County Office of Education personnel.

If a student is excluded, the student's guardian shall be notified of the student's right to return to school for the purpose of a conference. The conference shall be held within 36 hours, unless mutually agreed to by program administrator and parent(s), unless the student is physically unable to attend for any reason, including, but not limited to, incarceration or hospitalization. The conference shall then be held as soon as the student is physically able to return to school.

A Plan of Assistance will be initiated at the conference, or reviewed if already in place, per individual student/family need. Continued program options will be reviewed at that time. Additionally, community resource persons may be included to assist the student/family.

Child Development Programs (Head Start/Children's Center/State Preschool/ Early Head Start/School Age Child Care/Cal-Safe), Special Education Programs, Charter Extended Day, and Other Programs as Appropriate

The administrator or his/her designee may exclude any student if the administrator determines that an emergency situation exists. "Emergency situation" means a situation where it has been determined that the continued presence of the child would constitute a clear and present danger to the life, safety or health of the student, other students or El Dorado County Office of Education personnel.

If a child is excluded, the child's guardian shall be notified that the child may not return to the program without a conference, unless mutually agreed to by the program administrator and parent(s). At the conference, a plan will be initiated or reviewed, per individual student/family need pursuant to state and federal requirements. Continued program exclusion may be considered for up to 20 school days per incident requiring student removal.
