STUDENTS

Student Substance Abuse

The County Office of Education recognizes that the use of drugs, including alcoholic beverages, narcotics and hallucinogenic agents is detrimental to physical and mental health and may be symptomatic of underlying personal or academic problems. Students involved in the possession, sale, and/or use of substances as stated above shall be subject to disciplinary procedures which may result in suspension, expulsion, and/or referral to law enforcement.

It is the policy of the County Office of Education that instructional programs shall take positive action through education, counseling, parental involvement and/or medical referral in the handling of incidents in the schools involving the possession, sale, and /or use behavior-affecting substances and drug paraphernalia as defined in the Education Code. These substances shall include but shall not be limited to marijuana, LSD, glue, cocaine, PCP, alcohol, and barbiturates.

The County Office of Education prohibits possession or use of "tobacco products" by students while on County Office operated sites or while attending sponsored activities while under the supervision and control of County Office employees.

"Tobacco products" include any product containing tobacco or nicotine, including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, miniature cigars, smokeless tobacco, snuff, chew, clove cigarettes, betel, and nicotine delivery devices such as electronic cigarettes. Exceptions may be made for the use or possession of prescription nicotine products.

Prescription and non-prescription drugs which a student carries onto school property for ingestion as prescribed by a physician must be in the original containers and will be kept in the nurse's office, site administrator's office, or a secure location. Students involved in the possession, sale and/or use of behavior modifying substances shall be subject to disciplinary procedures which may result in suspension, expulsion, and/or referral to law enforcement.

Because keeping schools free of alcohol and other drugs is a concern common to the County Office and community, the County Office of Education supports cooperation among schools, parents/guardians, law enforcement, and other appropriate community organizations involved in preventing alcohol and other drug abuse.

Instruction

The County Office shall provide preventative instruction which helps student avoid the use of alcohol or other drugs. Comprehensive, age-appropriate K-12 instruction shall address the legal, social, and health consequences of drug and alcohol use.

Teachers shall be trained to answer students' questions related to alcohol and drugs and to help students obtain and use current and accurate information, develop and maintain a positive selfconcept, take positive actions to cope with stress, and use appropriate social and personal skills to resist involvement with alcohol and other drugs.

Intervention

The County Office of Education recognizes that there may be students on campuses who use tobacco products, alcohol, and other drugs and can benefit from intervention. The County Office of Education supports intervention programs that include the involvement of students, parents/guardians, and community agencies/organizations. Information about the signs of alcohol and other drug use and about appropriate agencies offering counseling and rehabilitation for students and their family members should be made available to students and parents/guardians. The County Office of Education believes that school personnel must be trained to identify symptoms which may indicate use of alcohol and other drugs.

Nonpunitive Self-Referral

The County Office of Education strongly encourages any student who is using tobacco products, alcohol, or drugs to discuss the matter with his/her parent/guardian or with any staff member. Students who first disclose their use of alcohol or other drugs when seeking help from an intervention or recovery program shall not be disciplined for such use.

Recovering Student Support

The County Office of Education desires to support recovering students in avoiding re-involvement with tobacco products, alcohol, and other drugs by providing school activities and support services which enhance recovery.

Enforcement/Discipline

The County Office of Education shall take appropriate action to help eliminate possession, use or sale of alcohol and other drugs, and related paraphernalia on school grounds, at school events, or in any situation in which the school is responsible for the conduct and well-being of students. Students possessing, selling, and/or using alcohol or other drugs or related paraphernalia shall be subject to disciplinary procedures which may result in suspension, expulsion, and/or referral to law enforcement. The County Office of Education supports the county-wide Memorandum of Understanding that has been developed with law enforcement and other public agencies.

Pursuant to Ed. Code 48900.5, the County Office of Education recognizes that other means of correction that address the student's use of tobacco products be implemented instead of suspension or expulsion. The County Office of Education may provide or refer students to counseling, intensive education, and other intervention services to assist in the cessation of tobacco use. Such intervention services shall be provided, as appropriate, as an alternative to suspension for tobacco possession.

School authorities may search students and school properties for the possession of alcohol and other drugs as long as such searches are conducted in accordance with law, County Office of Education policy, and administrative regulations.
