CALLING ALL SAINTS!

I think Martin Luther was on to something when he wrote about the "priesthood of all believers" – meaning that we need no intermediary to come to God – no priests, pastors or saints required. We can just talk to God as our Father (like in the Lord's Prayer!), BECAUSE through our baptism and Jesus' death on the cross as sacrifice for our sins, we are a part of the Family of God.

In Luther's time, the church taught that people could never be good enough on their own, so they were consigned to lengthy stays in "purgatory" (where their sins would be purged away) and that only saints were good enough to go directly to God. It was therefore reasoned that we should pray to the saints for help and for a share of their excess righteousness. One could, according to this reasoning, buy a relic of a saint and have access to power. Princes would purchase relics of saints or supposed pieces of Jesus' cross, and people would come, pray and make an offering for a specified amount of time to be released from purgatory. It was a great moneymaker! But, as Luther wondered – who knows if it's true?

It really is, for Lutherans especially, about reclaiming scripture as the one true authoritative source for figuring out how to live the Christian life. And we look especially to Jesus' life and death as examples of how to live in a way that is pleasing to God. Saints can be examples of *how to live* – Luther didn't so much have issues with that – but praying to them? Venerating their relics for release from punishment from God? Not so much. That's WHY JESUS CAME!

So, on All Saints' Sunday, we remember those "saints," those people of faith, who came before us, and thank God for their lives and that He blessed us with them in our lives. We entrust them to God's care, and look forward to the time when we are together with them again.

Jane Engler and the Youth Commission put together another successful movie night this past Friday night. A little chilly... but people were forewarned and came prepared. The movie chosen was *The Wizard of Oz* – especially projected on the 24' inflatable screen. I hadn't seen it in a number of years, and it was good to revisit it from my childhood. Donna Anderson, a year-round volunteer for Operation Christmas Child (OCC), was at chapel on September 23, 2022 and explained to the students about the shoeboxes.

Please consider packing a shoebox or two. Go to the office to get a red/green shoebox and a "What Goes in My Shoebox?" packet to help you in packing your shoebox. You may also get a paper for writing a note to enclose in your shoebox. (You can also use your own shoebox, but go to the office to get a packet and paper for a note if you do.)



Donate \$10 to cover collecting, shipping, and processing of the shoebox, as well as the ministry partner training and materials in the country to which the shoebox will go. You can:

- put an envelope with \$10 (cash or check made out to "Samaritan's Purse")
- put inside of the shoebox,
- go online and purchase a shipping label to adhere to the top of your shoebox, and you can follow your shoebox.

Be sure to attach the label on the top of your shoebox and indicate the gender and the age group for whom it is intended: boy or girl/2-4 years, 5-9 years, or 10-14 years.

Take your finished shoebox to the school office anytime between now and Nov. 18; Ms. Anderson will pick it up and take it to the shoebox drop-off location.

Thank you so much for your help in getting the Gospel out to children all of over the world. Westchester Lutheran Church & School did 146 boxes in 2021. Hopefully we can do more this year!
