CRISTO REY SPORTS COMPLEX UPDATE

The design of the Cristo Rey Sports Complex is complete and plans have been sent to the City of Sacramento for permit. Recommended adjustments have been received back to Cristo Rey and the last minor adjustments have been answered.

The Cristo Rey Board of Directors has released the production of the field material. FieldTurf USA will produce our "Field of Dreams." Principal, Andreas Agos and Assistant Principal, Dr. Steve Roberson toured many fields and spoke with other high school Athletic Directors to select this great field for Cristo Rey. Our new field will be a monofilament fiber over a pad. The fill will be a sand and cork mixture and will be cooler than other darker fields in the Sacramento Area. There will also be a water sprinkler system that can further cool the field for sporting events.

We have also been authorized by the Board of Directors to purchase a very bright but efficient LED lighting system from Musco Lighting. The lighting will provide over 30 foot candles of illumination and is the most efficient system on the market.

Our future plans include a permanent basketball court along with a block building structure. The structure will include bathrooms and storage as well as a snack bar for games and events. We hope this will enhance our ability to rent the complex to outside organizations to cover the ongoing costs of maintenance of the facility.

We plan to have a beautiful plaza with trees and bleachers. A fire lane is required by the fire department. Landscaping of the remainder of the areas will be the finishing touch on the entire complex.

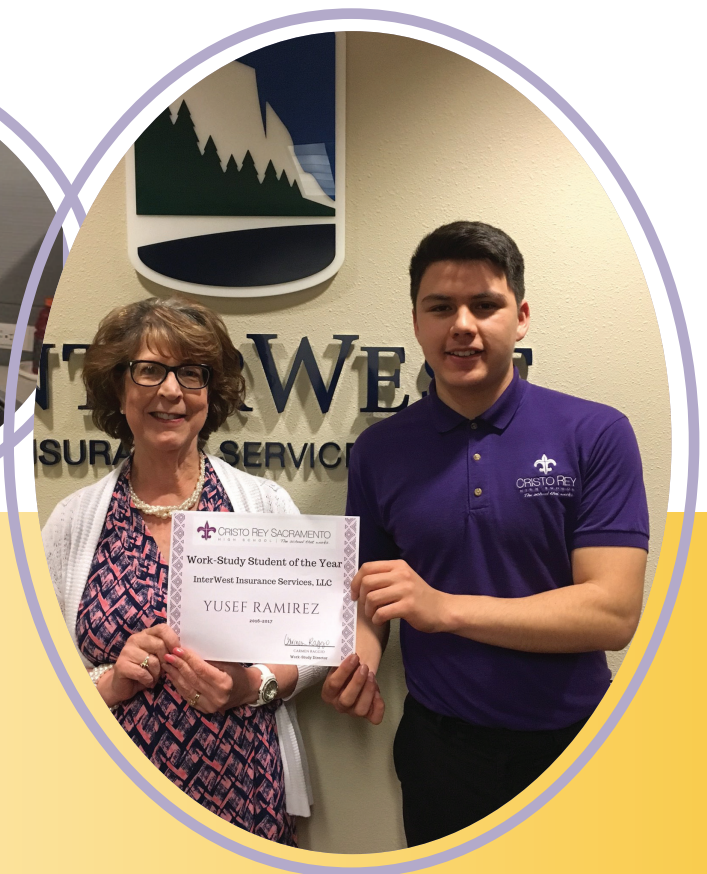

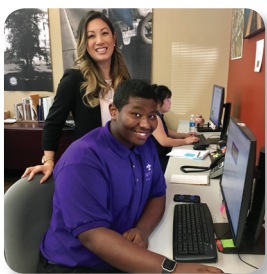

SUMMER AT STANFORD UNIVERSITY



This summer, I attended the Stanford Medical Youth Science Program, a five-week residential course for low-income and minority high school sophomores and juniors. Every summer, SMYSP selects 24 motivated teenagers from throughout Central and Northern California to study with Stanford professionals. I was one of the 375 high school students who applied for this program. I was also the only student from Sacramento to participate in this rigorous program.

At Stanford I was able to attend lectures by Stanford professors and medical professionals as well as serve a hospital internship at Stanford Health Care hospital. All of the program participants were taught an anatomy and physiology course by medical school students at the Stanford School of Medicine. I participated in laboratory workshops which allowed us to learn about anatomy and physiology using cadavers at the School of Medicine. At the end of the program, we were given a final exam in which we tested on our knowledge of everything we learned in anatomy lectures and labs. The program participants and I developed great study habits preparing for the final. We learned so much from each other and we all passed. In fact, I received the highest score on the final! Part of my achievement I believe stemmed from my passion of anatomy as well as the preparation I received from my biology teacher sophomore year, Ms. Tryon, who also wrote my letter of recommendation. The program participants and I also received one-on-one and group college admission counseling as well as guidance in essay and resume writing.

My family was able to visit me on Sundays from 9am to 2pm. I did not get homesick at all; I think I was just too busy to even have time to get homesick there. Most days we usually woke up at eight in the morning and went to sleep at night at eleven. The food was so good, and we even had our own chef, Ms. Netta. The courses were very fast paced. The campus was huge and we walked so much everyday. On Tuesdays and Thursdays when we had hospital internships, we would take the Marguerite shuttle to the Stanford School of Medicine and we'd walk the rest of the way to the hospital and to our units. On Mondays and Wednesdays when we attended lecture halls we walked across the whole campus to get to Herrin 185 where we had most of our lectures.

We had lectures about income inequality, health disparities, public health, and other fields of science and medicine. My experience of going away from my home and city was a bit overwhelming at first but that feeling later went away and I felt independent. At times, I would feel a bit sad and worried that I couldn't see my little brother and sister. I believe Cristo Rey really prepared me for this experience. Cristo Rey made me eager to go to college and pursue a higher education.

SUMMER AT NOTRE DAME

This summer, I was given the opportunity to attend the Summer Scholars Program at Notre Dame. During my two weeks there, I participated in the "From Malcolm X to the Beatles" track where I was able to learn about youth activism and oppression in the 60s. My professor provided us with an environment that allowed us to go back in time to the events of the 60s. We touched on subjects like the Chicano Movement and the Black Panthers. I learned about oppression and the people's struggle to combat it. These are topics that are very relevant to what is going on in our country today. I've spent all my life dreaming of making a change, and it was in this program that my eyes were opened to the realities of our country's past, which helped my determination in being a part of making a country with a better future for all to grow.

Not only was I able to see how much our country has grown, I was also able to grow during these two weeks. It was my first time ever flying to the Midwest and I didn't know what to expect. I was nervous. The only time I had ever flown was to Mexico, where I was surrounded by people of my own culture. I felt as if I was stepping into a new territory, but I was also excited to be going to the school of my dreams, a school that had presented me with the opportunity to grow. When I first got there, I felt out of place. I didn't feel a connection with any person; they were different from me. I came from a different background than most of the people there, and felt as if I couldn't engage or relate to any of the conversations they had. So, I built a wall that prevented me from building any relationships between myself and those who I deemed as different. Two good things came from this. I was able to find people who shared the same struggles as me and was able to build a bond with them, many of whom came from other Cristo Rey schools across the country. I still keep in touch with the people I now call my friends, and we hope to see each other again before we go off to college. The rest of my time at Notre Dame, my barrier was broken down, and I was able to get to know every person I came across. I got to hear about their life, goals, and just about them as a person. Here, I was able to see the importance of getting to know others by looking beyond their appearance. Although there were differences between class and background, we all share the dream of getting ahead and the hope of doing something with our lives.

My two weeks at Notre Dame were also very fun. I got to go to Chicago and visit the National Museum of Mexican Art as well as the Chicago Film Archives. Our counselors at Notre Dame planned many events for us where we were able to build a community during our time there. We had a bonfire night, celebrated Fourth of July, and I was able to go ice skating for the first time. The memories made are ones that I will always have with me.

My experience at Notre Dame was truly unforgettable. I would like to thank Cristo Rey for giving me an opportunity like this. If it weren't for Cristo Rey, I would've never believed that attending a summer program would be a reality for me. My journey at Cristo Rey is coming to an end, and after being able to experience college life at Notre Dame, I am now more than ever determined to go to college.

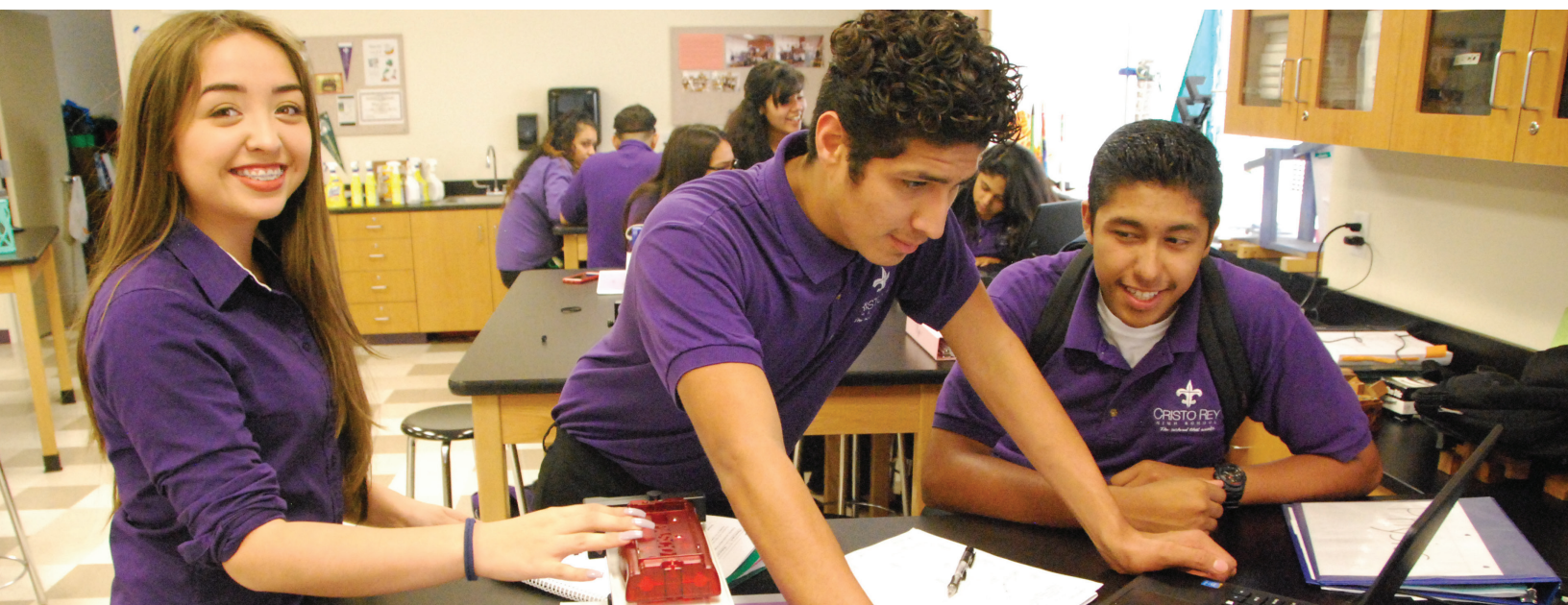

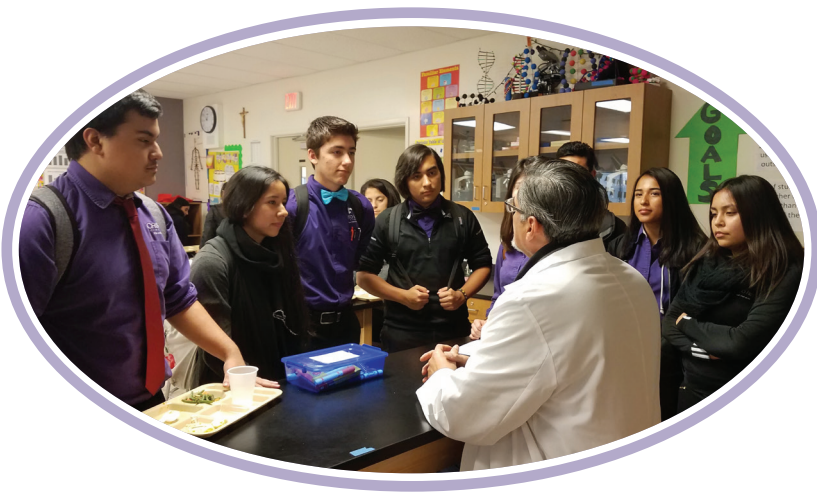
My five siblings and I were students at St. Mary's School and St. Paul High School because donors made Catholic education affordable for our family. All six of us are college graduates.

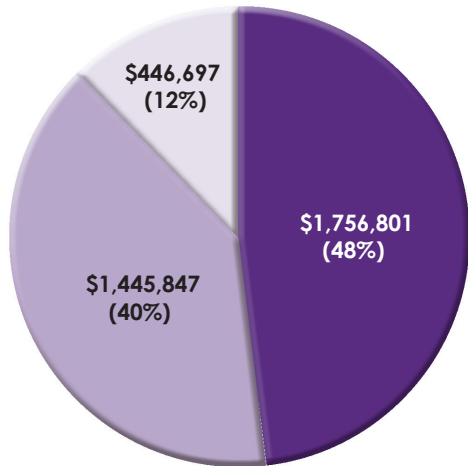

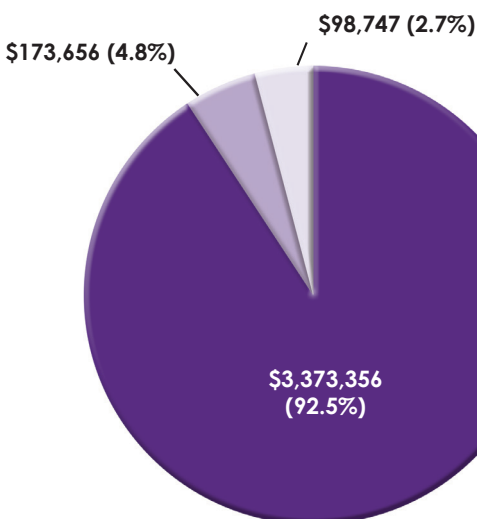
