



An important component in today's learning is technology. Technology is all around us: it's how we work, it's how we live, it's how we communicate, it's how we socialize.


Cristo Rey was in desperate need of updated technology. The computer lab the students were using was originally set up in 2006 and they were still using the original desktop computers from 2006!

To continue to offer a college preparatory education and to provide the best service possible to our sponsors, we needed to upgrade the school's TECHNOLOGY. And to accomplish this we turned to you, our benefactors. During the 2013 Scholarship Dinner and Auction we asked our attendees to help us 'make a difference' and give us the resources to bring our students into the 21st century. ## Local Couple Generously Supports Cristo Rey Mission

While the Cristo Rey mission is admired by many, for some it touches a special nerve and generates a real connection. Such is the case for Dr. Dennis Marks and his wife Nancy. While Nancy is passionate about supporting local education initiatives, Dennis says he can remember walking the same path as the Cristo Rey students. "I was in the same position as they are – working while also going to high school," he explains. "It is not easy."



Because of this special connection to the challenges faced by Cristo Rey Sacramento and its students, the Markses have given generously to the school. Working with Mercy Foundation, Dennis and Nancy directed \$500,000 through their donor advised fund earmarked for a proposed new facility. They also have committed an additional \$500,000 to Mercy Foundation over the next five years in support of Cristo Rey's program enhancements. "We are so impressed by what they are doing here," says Nancy. "We want to support them any way we can and to encourage them to continue the fabulous work they are doing. We want Cristo Rey to be able to help as many children as possible."

That giving spirit toward children is something that Dennis felt very early on in his life. As a five year old growing up in New York City, he watched as the neighborhood doctor came to his apartment and saved his young cousin who was dying from pneumonia. Inspired to help children in need in the same way, Dennis worked at a medical lab while attending high school,

graduated early and attended Columbia College and then New York University Medical School. He became a pediatrician and settled in Sacramento, where he and Nancy raised four children. He practiced medicine for 30 years before retiring in 1986.

Over the years, the Markses became active in the community and supported projects that focused on the priorities near and dear to their hearts. "My passions include our church, the developmentally disabled, pediatric hospitals, education and the arts," says Nancy. For them, Cristo Rey and its mission to provide a college preparatory education to motivated students with limited financial means was a natural choice. "My parents were immigrants from Greece," recalls Dennis. "No one in my family had graduated from college before, but they always supported me."

Dennis and Nancy hope that through their gift, more students will have access to the remarkable program available at Cristo Rey and that the resources available there will be in line with the very best schools in the area. "These kids have such ability but they face serious challenges," says Nancy. "We just want to help them get the quality education they need and deserve."




