Ana, Class of 2010

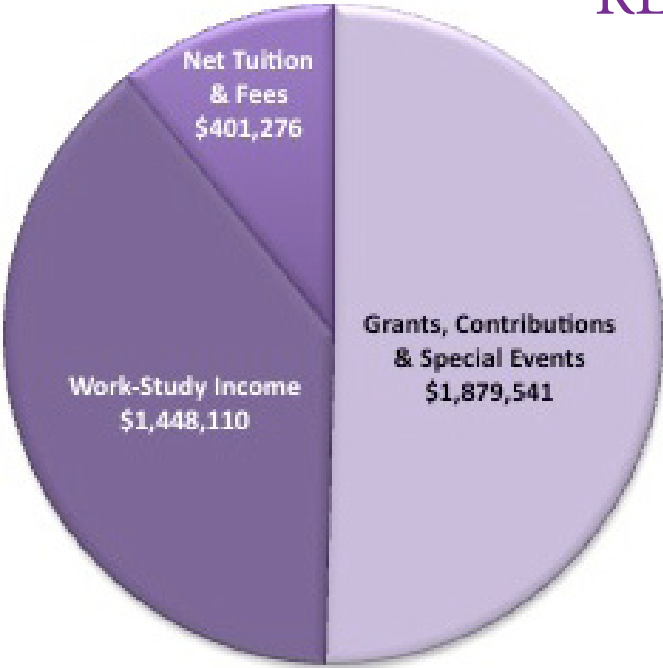

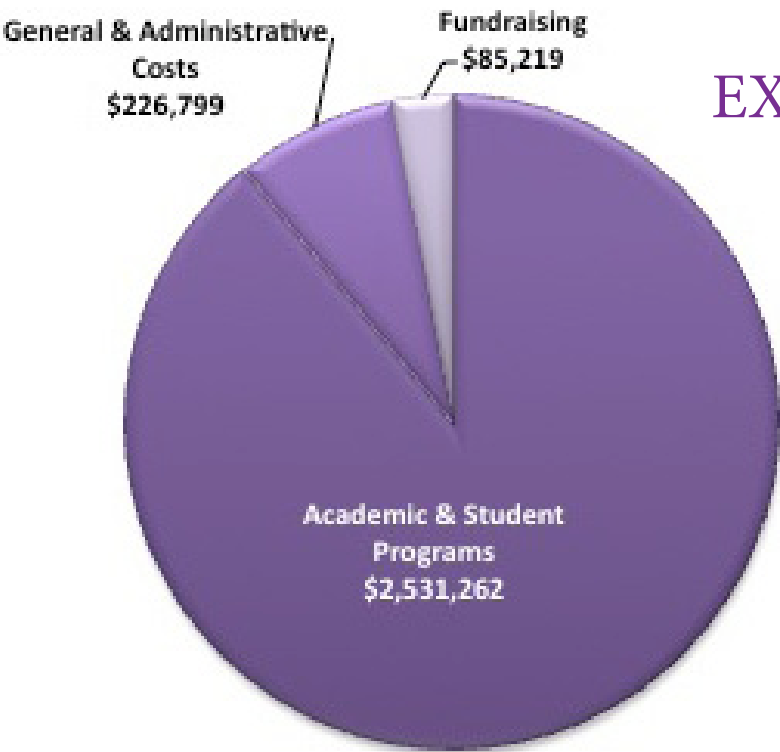


Fiscal Year 2011-12 Financial Report
