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





Dr. Gorby will perform a composition of his for organ and orchestra in a concert in September with the Chamber Symphony of the Springs at First United Methodist Church. The piece is entitled "An American Tone Poem", the last two movements of which were composed in 2021, and the first two movements were composed this year. If you can't make it, you may still be able to see a video of the performance on youtube. The piece tries to answer the question "what kind of place is America?" and was composed after hearing many of the works which won a composition competition held by the philharmonic some years ago where composers were tasked with using themes "America the Beautiful" as the basis for a piece. Dr. Gorby wanted to capture some of

the heroic aspects of our shared history in sound, programmatically representing the four verses of the hymn. In this sense, the composition is close in concept to works by Franz Liszt, and even uses his innovative (for the time) "thematic transformation" approach to constantly refresh the theme as it traverses the colors of the organ and orchestra. It is, of course, a secular work, however, Dr. Gorby believes there can only be benefits to be accrued to the church and the community at large by engaging in such artistic work. He hopes to see you there!

An 8-Class series on The Chronicles of Narnia by C.S. Lewis



"In reading The Chronicles of Narnia, we find ourselves in the presence of great and necessary truths. ... They were written with children in mind, even if they contain an abundance of deep theological, philosophical and historical context that will only be understood on a deeper level by adults." Joseph Pearce

C.S. Lewis (1898-1963) was one of the most influential Christian authors of the 20th century. A professor of literature and philosophy at both Cambridge and Oxford, he was a prolific author of works of literary criticism, apologetics, philosophy, theology, science fiction, and fantasy, in addition to lecturing and broadcasting.

Without question, his most successful and widely-known work is the seven-book series *The Chronicles of Narnia*. Infused with Christian themes and a profoundly Christian worldview, this series has "baptized the imaginations" of thousands. Join CCCA in their study of the Chronicles!

We have read these works to our children, but now, as adults, re-enter the Wardrobe to understand Narnia on an **even deeper philosophical**, **theological**, **and Christological level**. Let this deeper understanding enliven your appreciation for our Catholic faith!

Happy feast day of the Transfiguration of Jesus! You may meditate on this Gospel scene during the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary, introduced to the world by St. John Paul II in his apostolic letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae (The Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary). But, did you know it was first "developed" by another saint priest a generation before? Fr. Don Calloway explains, "Unbeknownst to most people, it was St. George Preca (a holy priest from the island of Malta) who proposed a new set of mysteries called the 'Mysteries of Light' in 1957. The mysteries he desired to see promoted were the same five mysteries that St. John Paul II used to sharpen the blade of the rosary 45 years later in his 2002 apostolic letter on the rosary, a letter that essentially transformed the rosary into a modern day lightsaber." I recommend the following Formed Bible study on the Transfiguration of Jesus which goes over the New and Old Testament typological connections we find in this beautiful mystery: https://app.formed.org/app/videos/1313619

Do you have an "Even now" faith? Last week we celebrated the feast day for St. Martha, along with her siblings Sts. Lazarus and Mary. In John's Gospel we hear Martha make a raw and beautiful prayer of holy abandonment: "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." How many times do we say something similar to our loving Lord? "Jesus, if only you had spared me of this trial, or given me the grace to face it with courage, then I would not be hurting so deeply." It is easy to see Jesus in a disfigured way, this is one of the side effects of Original Sin. Do we have the strength of faith to continue like Martha, "But even now, before the pain has gone away or Your resolution has been revealed, I will praise You and love You. 'The Lord gives, and the Lord takes away; blessed be the Name of the Lord'." Today, in honor of the Transfiguration of Jesus, I encourage you to make St. Martha's prayer your own and then resolve to attend one daily Mass next week.
